Consecration Sunday Is Coming

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

St. Mary's Vestry has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, November 16, 2014, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and governing board members. Since we will make no followup visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

Join us in Greenville... at Rock Springs Center, 4025 NC Highway 43 N, on Saturday, November 8th, at 11:00 a.m. as the Rev. Rob Skirving, will be consecrated (ordained a bishop) and become the VIII Bishop of the Diocese of East Carolina. It will be a festive service with the Bishop Michael Curry (Diocese of NC) preaching and the Most Rev. Katharine Jefferts Schori (Presiding Bishop and Primate of the Episcopal Church) as the chief consecrator. Many bishops of the Episcopal Church and their ecumenical counterparts will be in attendance as well. There will be clergy, young people and



musicians and choirs. The door at Rock Spring will open at 9:00 a.m. There is no reserved seating. It is on a first come basis. Invite your family and friends to take part in this day of celebration.



Bishop to preach. . .The Rt. Rev. Julio César Holguín, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of the Dominican Republic, will be our guest preacher on **Sunday**, **November 9th**. Bishop Holguín will be in the diocese to attend the consecration of the Rev. Rob Skirving the day before. Bishop Holguín is the third bishop of the Diocese of the Dominican Republic and was born and raised in San Francisco de Macorís which is in the Cibao valley of the Dominican Republic. He and his family were among the early converts (in the early 1950's) to the first mission of the Episcopal Church in San Francisco. The Diocese of the Dominican

Republic is the fastest growing diocese in the Episcopal Church. During his term as bishop since 1991, Bishop Holguín has provided the leadership for the dynamic growth of the Dominican Episcopal Church. Bishop Holguín will also address the adult Sunday school class this day in Moseley Hall. Plan to join us.


Advent & Christmas Devotional
